Combining archival research with interdisciplinary theoretical grounding, my project argues that representations of race, and racial Blackness in particular, played a central role in the development of literary modernism's tropes of self-alienation and self-fragmentation, critically recasting the modernist era as one constitutively dependent on the fate of the "New Negro" as a powerful figure capable of deconstructing the global Color Line.
